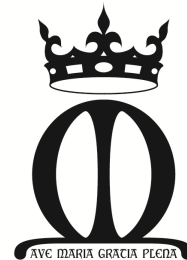

St Marie's Selected Charity for 2016: the Hospice Madre Teresa in Lujan, Argentina

The PPC are pleased to announce the winner of our charity selection process 2016 - the Argentinian Hospice Madre Teresa. Thank you to all those parishioners who submitted nominations for us to consider!

The hospice helps dying patients to live out their last days in peace, and to move from this world back into God's loving arms. It provides free palliative care to poor patients who are terminally ill, including medical, psychological and especially spiritual support for them and their families. The hospice is run for 50+ volunteers including doctors, psychologists, priests, etc. They provide assistance to approximately 120 patients and their families per year. It only has 4 beds, with half of the patients being supported at home until they pass away. They manage to operate on a budget of only £50,000 per year, so whatever money we can raise for them over the next 12 months will make a big difference. There will be an opportunity to meet the Bishop for refreshments at the Pastoral Centre after Mass.



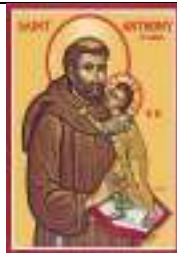
Jubilee Year Mass for the Sick and Disabled – Saturday 11 June

St Anthony of Padua:

Born 15 August 1195 Lisbon, Portugal, Died 13 June 1231 (aged 35) Padua, Italy

Anthony of Padua, OFM was a Portuguese Catholic friar belonging to the Franciscan Order. He was born and raised in a wealthy family in Lisbon. Noted by his contemporaries for his forceful preaching and expert knowledge of scripture, he was the fastest canonised saint ever in the Church's history. He was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church on 16 January 1946.

He is Patron of: Lost people or things; American Indians; animals; infertility; Brazil; the elderly; fishermen; harvests; horses; the oppressed and poor; Portugal; pregnant women; shipwrecks; and travellers.
