Meeting The Cathedral's Costs—Ways to Donate: The Cathedral exists to meet the needs of our local communities. It provides a full range of weekend Masses, and multiple opportunities for prayer and worship during the week. It also provides a range faith development/sacramental programmes for both children and adults, and witnesses lots of baptisms, marriages and funerals throughout the year. But it costs a lot to keep this church running, despite the generosity of our very many volunteers. Last year, it was established that we needed to hit a weekly Sunday collection target of £1500 in order to support two priests and continue with the full range of weekend Masses currently on offer. Every penny helps, so please give what you can. And if you are a UK Taxpayer, please consider setting up a regular method of donating, so that the Cathedral can claim an extra 25p in every pound. (This is at no extra cost to you, via the Government's GiftAid scheme). There are GiftAid leaflets available at the back of Church to set up a regular Standing Order, or to join our GiftAid envelope scheme if you prefer to give cash. Many thanks.
