From next weekend, public Masses will once again be celebrated at St Marie's! The times of the Masses are above—please note the changes. To ensure that the government's social-distancing guidelines are followed, **booking will be necessary**. Please see the notice on the next page for more information.

RE-OPENING OF ST MARIE'S CATHEDRAL FOR PUBLIC WORSHIP

We are delighted to let you know that, **from the weekend of 4th/5th July, St Marie's Cathedral will be once again open for public Masses!**

In order to keep everyone safe, we are closely following the guidelines of the Government and the Catholic Bishops of England and Wales. These include cleaning the church between Masses and having hand sanitiser available for all to use before they enter and as they leave. A one-way system will be introduced, and social distancing measures will be in place. Stewards will be on hand to help implement these.

To begin with, numbers at Mass will need to be limited, so we are introducing a simple text-based booking system, where you will be able to book attendance at your preferred Mass time. You will need to text the appropriate Mass code, followed by a space and then the number of people you are booking for, to our dedicated automated Mass Booking Service on **07476 558810**. Mass codes are created by using the first three letters of the day, immediately followed by the Mass time in four digits (24-hour clock format). For example:

- If you want to book a place at the 9.30am Sunday Mass for yourself, you would text the code Sun0930 1 to the Mass Booking Service number above.
- Or, if your family of five wanted to attend the 5.30pm Saturday Vigil Mass, you would text the code Sat1730 5.

Please note we will assume that, if you are booking any number between 3 and 6, this is for one household. If you are booking for unrelated people who are not in the same household, please book using separate text messages for each person.

The live-streamed Mass will continue at 11.00am and a few places are available at this Mass, so if you wish to attend this Mass, please use the code Sun1100. Further details about the booking system are available on the Cathedral website, and bookings will open on Monday 29th June.

Anyone unable to use the text-based system can ring the Cathedral Office (0114 272 2522) to book. We hope to be able to accommodate everyone, but this may not always be at your first choice of time. As you come to Mass, we would ask you not to arrive too early and to leave promptly afterwards so that the Church can be cleaned between Masses.

Hopefully, if things continue to improve, some of these measures could be relaxed allowing us to increase the numbers we can accommodate at any one time.

A note about data protection (GDPR): Because we are using mobile phone numbers as a method of allocating places, we need to let you know that we are using the numbers for this purpose, and by texting us in this way you consent to the use of your number for the purpose of allocation. The phone numbers are not linked in any way to names and addresses, and will be kept for 21 days before being destroyed.

We pray for Annie O'Connor, and all those who have died recently.
