Confessions: Monday–Saturday, from 11.30am–12.15pm in St Joseph's Chapel. For everyone's safety, there will be a protective plastic screen in place. Please stand while making your confession.

Mass Booking System: Following the guidelines of the Government and the Catholic Bishops of England and Wales, a simple text-based Mass booking system is now in place for the Saturday Vigil Mass and all Sunday Masses at St Marie's Cathedral. You will need to text the appropriate Mass code, followed by a space and then the number of people you are booking for, to **07476 558810**. The Mass codes are as follows:

Mass Time	Code
Saturday, 5.30pm	Sat1730
Sunday, 8.00am	Sun0800
Sunday, 9.30am	Sun0930
Sunday, 11.00am	Sun1100
Sunday, 12.30pm	Sun1230
Sunday, 6.30pm	Sun1830

So, to give an example, if you wanted to book three places at the 9.30am Sunday Mass, you would text **Sun0930 3** to 07476 558810, and so on. Anyone unable to use the text-based system can ring the Cathedral Office (0114 272 2522) to book. Please only book for a Mass if you are sure you will be able to attend, so that everyone who wants to come to Mass can do so!

If you are unable to attend the Mass you have booked places for, please let us know by contacting the office (e-mail office@stmariecathedral.org, tel. 0114 272 2522) during office hours. If you need to cancel your place on the weekend of the Mass, please let the PPC know instead on PPC@stmariecathedral.org, and we will inform the stewards on duty. Thank you.

A note about data protection (GDPR): Because we are using mobile phone numbers as a method of allocating places, we need to let you know that we are using the numbers for this purpose, and by texting us in this way you consent to the use of your number for the purpose of allocation. The phone numbers are not linked in any way to names and addresses, and will be kept for 21 days before being destroyed.

November Memorial List

November is the month in which we pray especially for the dead. Each parish brings together these prayers for their friends and family in the November Memorial List Masses celebrated throughout the coming year.

Forms are available from the back of the Cathedral, on which you can list the names of individual family and friends, or make a family request (e.g. “Deceased members of the N. family”). Please place the form in the envelope provided, together with your donation, and hand it to one of the priests or stewards, or put it through the letterbox at Cathedral House. For St Oswald’s and Holy Family, the forms are available from the back of church, and should be placed in the envelope, together with your donation, and handed to one of the priests or (for St Oswald’s) one of the sisters.

Prayers for the Dead (City Road Cemetery): This year, All Saints' Day (1st November) falls on a Sunday, so at 3.00pm in the afternoon there will be a small, socially-distanced gathering to pray for the dead interred at City Road Cemetery, starting at the old Catholic chapel. Everyone is welcome to come and pray, following the current rules in place (i.e. 'rule of six', no mixing, and so on).

Advance Notice—Children's First Holy Communion and Confirmation programmes: both the First Holy Communion and the Confirmation programmes for children will start in January 2021. Registration for these two programmes will begin in December, and will be announced in the bulletin.

The Gospel, for Children and Families: Each week we put resources on our website to help children and families engage with - and discuss - the Word of God. We do a short illustrated Gospel to help bring it to life (a YouTube video of about 3-4 minutes long). There is also a longer Children's Liturgy video (usually about 15 minutes long), which additionally includes some child-friendly prayers and a discussion about Gospel. And then there is a weekly Children's Activity Sheet based on the Gospel, with activities such as a Colouring-in page, a Crossword and a Word Search, available to download and print off at home. National Rosary Rally: Saturday 31st October

3.00-4.00pm for the Diocese of Hallam



St Marie's Cathedral will be taking part in the National Rosary Rally on Saturday 31st October, and our Diocese has been allocated the hour from 3.00-4.00pm as part of this powerful prayer initiative.

Our Blessed Mother often encourages us to pray the Holy Rosary as a form of protection, to create peace between families, societies and nations, and for the conversion of sinners too. In this time of the pandemic, economic uncertainty and social unrest, our prayers are definitely needed! The more people that get involved, the more powerful our prayers will become—so please do join us.

There are three ways you can get involved:

1. Turn up in person to join the Bishop and Fr Callistus in the Cathedral, from 3.00pm next Saturday (31st October).
2. Join the daily telephone Rosary Group by dialling 0203 901 7895. When you hear a voice, enter the Meeting ID: 847 0371 2201, followed by # (the hash key or square key). When prompted to enter the Participant ID, just press # again.
3. Pray the full Rosary at home (by yourself or with your family/household) between the hours of 3.00-4.00pm.
