Confessions: Monday–Saturday, from 11.30am–12.15pm in St Joseph's Chapel. For everyone's safety, there will be a protective plastic screen in place. Please stand while making your confession.

Mass Booking System: Due to the current laws and guidelines in place, it is necessary for everyone to book a place at the Saturday Vigil and all Sunday Masses at St Marie's Cathedral. Please text the appropriate Mass code, followed by a space and then the number of people you are booking for, to **07476 558810**. So, to give an example, if you wanted to book three places at the 9.30am Sunday Mass, you would text **Sun0930 3** to 07476 558810, and so on.

Revised Constitution for the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC): Over the last few months, the St Marie's PPC have been revising its constitution, which details how the PPC is formed, how it operates and its overall role within the parish. A draft constitution has been agreed, and this now needs to be open to review and scrutiny by parishioners. The draft can be seen on the noticeboard just inside the Cathedral's entrance, and also on the website (<https://stmariecathedral.org/parish-community/parish-management/>). Comments, views and suggestions are most welcome—please discuss with any PPC member or email ppc@stmariecathedral.org. The final Constitution will be published in one month's time.

Lenten Talks During Holy Week: Our three Lenten Talks will be happening this year, but will take place over Zoom. They will take place on the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday evenings of Holy Week (29th–31st March), all at 7.00pm. On Monday, the talk will be about what we can learn from lockdown, and how that relates to Jesus' time in the desert. On Tuesday, the talk will look at how our own sacrifices point to Calvary. The Talk on Wednesday will be about how we can grow during periods of suffering. The format will be a live/recorded talk, with opportunities for Q&A afterwards with our guest speakers, and followed by the chance for smaller group discussion in our Zoom breakout 'rooms'. Details of speakers, and the actual title of their talk, will be circulated next weekend.

Join Us in a Novena Of Prayer Divine to The Divine Mercy—starts on Good Friday: Divine Mercy Sunday is on the 2nd Sunday of Easter, and is a time where we are all encouraged to say a Novena of the Divine Mercy Chaplet, starting on Good Friday. (A Novena simply means 9 days of prayer.) The Divine Mercy Chaplet was given to St Faustina by Jesus Christ himself, and is a beautiful prayer using a set of rosary beads. Easter Flowers and the Easter Garden: The Flower Team would welcome gifts of money and flowers towards the Easter decorations. Cash donations can be put in envelopes labelled "Easter Flowers" and either posted at Cathedral House or given to a steward. Gifts of yellow or white flowers can also be left with a steward, by Good Friday. Thank you in advance for your continuing generosity.

Blessings of Easter Food: The traditional blessing of Easter foods will take place on Holy Saturday (3rd April) at the Cathedral, from 2.30-3.30pm in Polish (*Święconka*), and from 4.00-5.00pm in Slovak (*Požehnanie veľkonočných pokrmov*).

Supporting Faith Development in Children: Our weekly Children's Liturgy videos help to support our youngest parishioners in their faith development. Each week we engage our youngsters in the *Sorry Prayer*, watch an illustrated Gospel, and thoroughly explore what each Gospel can teach us. We also do a shorter video for older children/families/adults—the Illustrated Gospel—with questions for further reflection and/or discussion.
