Mass Booking System: Due to the current laws and guidelines in place, it is necessary for everyone to book a place at the Saturday Vigil and all Sunday Masses at St Marie's Cathedral. Please text the appropriate Mass code, followed by a space and then the number of people you are booking for, to **07476 558810**. So, to give an example, if you wanted to book three places at the 9.30am Sunday Mass, you would text **Sun0930 3** to 07476 558810, and so on.

In memory of Canon Samuel Walshaw, Rector of St Marie's, who died 125 years ago

This year marks the 125th anniversary of the death of Canon Samuel Walshaw, who was the priest at St Marie's from 1866 until his death on April 14th, 1896. Canon Walshaw led fund raising initiatives that resulted in the development of local Catholic schools and the replacement of St Marie's ill-sounding steel bells with the eight bronze bells that hang in the Cathedral tower to this day, donating £60 himself—about £6,800 in today's money—towards the bells.

He also spearheaded the completion of the shrine to Our Lady, donating the two marble columns that support the shrine, and had the shrine to Our Lady of Perpetual Succour erected in the Mortuary Chapel, in addition to the memorial to the clergy in the same chapel.

Canon Walshaw developed the church's choir and was the incumbent when St Marie's cleared its construction debts and could finally be consecrated in 1880, 30 years after construction had been completed.

We also remember George Holmes, who was a bell ringer at St Marie's for 24 years, starting in 1879 and died 70 years ago this year, aged 89. During his time as a bell ringer, he took part in 58 peals, each of which would have involved ringing for more than three and a half hours.
