Mass Booking System: Due to the current laws and guidelines in place, it is necessary for everyone to book a place at the Saturday Vigil and all Sunday Masses at St Marie's Cathedral. Please text the appropriate Mass code, followed by a space and then the number of people you are booking for, to **07476 558810**. So, to give an example, if you wanted to book three places at the 9.30am Sunday Mass, you would text **Sun0930 3** to 07476 558810, and so on.

If you are unable to attend the Mass you have booked places for, please let us know by contacting the Cathedral Office during office hours or, outside of office hours, the PPC (PPC@stmariecathedral.org). A note about data protection (GDPR): By texting us in this way, you consent to the use of your number for the purposes of the booking system. The phone numbers are not linked in any way to names and addresses, and will be kept for 21 days before being destroyed.



Lenten Talks—a Big Thank You: We would like to offer sincere thanks to all three of our guest speakers this year, who led us through three very interesting evenings of thoughtful reflection for Holy Week! In his talk on Monday, Fr Grant Naylor reassured us that even if we might feel alone at times, God has not abandoned us. And he highlighted that as we come out of this series of lockdowns, we will have a choice to make: do we want to turn in on ourselves, or out on the world? On Tuesday, Josh Glicklich helped us to explore the difference between sacrifice and suffering, and how suffering can be turned into sacrifice by giving it purpose. And on Wednesday, Mary Phillips challenged us to think about how our own physical, mental and / or spiritual suffering, and how that can help us to grow closer to God. We finish with Mary's Action Points for what do do in times of suffering: (1) Praise God! (2) Pray - speak to Our Lady and speak to the saints; ask them to pray for you; (3) Give your suffering a purpose - name it, and offer it up to God; (4) Ask for healing - Jesus shows us that it is okay to ask! If God says no, then accept it and trust Him—we are in safe hands... Wishing you all a Happy Easter—thanks be to God!
