Please think about adopting a strategy of not giving money directly to people on the streets. *If you have the time and money, offer to buy them a cup of tea or a sandwich instead. Supporting sellers of the Big Issue North is a good way to help too! Or consider giving to a Sheffield charity that will help people to make a long-term, positive change.*

Christian Village of St Marie's—Talk and Social, Saturday 1st October, 6.00pm: The next meeting of the Village will take place on Saturday 1st October at 6.00pm, and the theme is 'Faith: a journey of the heart'. Candida will be leading the scripture and discussion, and it will finish with song of praise before the shared supper.
