**Heritage Open Days: 9th–18th September 2022:** The Heritage Open Days are a national event, during which heritage buildings, walks and industries are invited to open their doors to visitors. St Marie's has taken part for a number of years, and this year will be no exception. **Supporting the Homeless and Vulnerable in Sheffield—Top Tip #4:** There is a high degree of risk for individuals who engage with street culture, including exploitation and bullying. The violence and physical harm within street culture groups often goes unreported. This means individuals who frequent the streets for prolonged periods of time are at a higher risk of physical and psychological harm, and will already be very stressed. *Always show respect to people on the streets, without judgement. If there is aggression, be quick to realise that this individual is just having a really bad day. Don't take it personally, and try hard not to do or say anything that may escalate the issue.*

St Bernadette saw the Virgin Mary eighteen times in a series of Apparitions that took place in a cave on the outskirts of Lourdes (France) in 1858.
