An Important Message About Your Energy Bills: One of our parishioners is an Internal Auditor for CFCU Credit Union, and has come to realise that many people are confused about the Government's energy cap. She would like us all to be super clear on three important points: (1) £2,500 is *not* the maximum amount people will have to spend this winter; (2) it is the unit price of your energy that is capped, *not* your overall bill, and (3): the only way you can bring down your energy bills this winter is by using less energy. Please pass this information on to anyone who may have misunderstood this cap, and what it will mean for them this winter.

The family consists of two young parents and four children, including a new-born baby. One of the children is severely disabled and the family has complex social and health needs. The parents are very enthusiastic about learning English and are keen to integrate into life in Sheffield, and the three older children are in school.
