Christ's Sacrifice on the Cross—made present at every Mass: Few of us truly appreciate the enormity of what actually happens at Mass - the daily miracle of love, where bread and wine become God! Christ's sacrifice on the cross is made present anew, at every Eucharist. It is a unique sacrifice, where Christ is both priest and victim. By consuming Christ in the Eucharist, we are joining ourselves to Jesus' sacrifice; our lives then become an offering to the Father—in Him, with Him and through Him. Sacrifice has always played a major part in our worship of God—a tangible gift to God, where all comes from Him anyway. Sacrifices can express our thanksgiving for the blessings God has given us, and our humble submission to God's authority. They can be an offer of atonement for our sins, or an appeal for mercy. Or they can be all of the above! As Christians today, we are asked to offer a variety of sacrifices: praise, prayer, almsgiving and other charitable works. Did you know that our attendance at Mass, itself, is a form of modern-day sacrifice? So please let us offer our sacrifice worthily! We can do this by making sure we arrive at Mass in plenty of time for the start, and by choosing to stay for the entire duration. We can do it by participating with the Mass as fully as we can—joining in with joyful singing and with heartfelt praise for our amazing God! And let us also be reminded of the enormity of what we are actually receiving at Holy Communion: God's love for us, embodied in Jesus Christ, and present in the Eucharist as food and drink... Food and drink needed to sustain us on our very long journeys 'home'... Because we all come from God, and whether we remember it or not, we are all trying to find our way back to God.
