**About the Feast of All Saints:** All Saints' Day, also known as All Hallows' Day, is in honour of all those who have gone before us and who have reached heaven, whether they are known or unknown. It stems from our Catholic belief that there is a powerful spiritual bond between the saints in heaven (the 'Church triumphant'), us, the living (the 'Church militant'), and the faithful departed who are currently going through the final process of purification in purgatory (the 'Church penitent'). We are all called to holiness — to become saints ourselves, and to receive the fullness of life through Christ. We are all called to answer God's personal call to us, to collaborate with Him through with the promptings of Holy Spirit, and with the help of His grace, to become saints ourselves. As we struggle with the challenges our lives will inevitably bring, let us call upon the help of our brothers and sisters in Christ who have already succeeded; let us give them honour, and invite them to come and pray with us as we run our own spiritual race to the end.

# **November Memorial List 2022-23**

November is the month in which we pray especially for the dead. Each parish brings together these prayers for their friends and family in the November Memorial List Masses celebrated throughout the coming year.

Forms are available on which you can list the names of individual family and friends, or make a family request (e.g. "Deceased members of the N. family"). Please place the form in the envelope provided, together with your donation, and hand it to one of the priests or stewards, put it in one of the donation pillars in the Cathedral, or post it through the letterbox at Cathedral House.

During the month of November there will also be an opportunity to remember the dead by <u>writing a Memoriam card and placing it in a basket</u>. Both cards and basket are in the Mortuary Chapel. On Saturday 2nd December at the 12.30pm Mass, the basket will be brought to the altar for a special dedication.

**Mothers Prayers Group—every Thursday at 1.00pm, in the Parish Room:** Mothers, grandmothers, spiritual mothers and Godmothers are all invited to join Candida for Mother's Prayers, in the Parish Room, straight after the lunchtime Mass. Do join us!

**Confirmation Preparation Programme:** This year's Confirmation Preparation Programme for those of secondary school age from Y8 upwards will run from January to May 2024. Confirmations will be celebrated on Pentecost (19th May 2024). The sessions to prepare will be on Monday evenings in term time from January to May. If you would like your child to be confirmed, you and they will need to meet with a member of the clergy and a member of the catechetical team on one evening in November or December. There is a signup form in the sacristy for you to pick a time to meet us. More information about the course will be given at this meeting. Please bring your child's baptism certificate with you to this meeting! The deadline to sign up is Sunday 3rd December.

The month of November—Commemoration of the Dead: November is the month when we especially remember the faithful departed, and we are invited to offer prayers and sacrifices for all the souls in purgatory. During the course of this month, we will be sharing with you some of the Catholic prayers we should all have in our prayer 'armoury' to do this. A prayer is never wasted, so let us unite and pray for our departed brothers and sisters! <a href="Prayer for the Dead:">Prayer for the Dead:</a> Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in Peace. Amen.

## Vacancy at the Cathedral: Sacristan (part-time)

We are looking to appoint ASAP, ideally for the start of Advent 2023, a new permanent part-time Sacristan for the Cathedral. The post will involve 8 hours per week, to be worked flexibly throughout the week but including some time on Sunday mornings. There will also be a requirement to be available for all the main services of the Triduum, Easter and Christmas. (Time off in lieu will be available for any extra hours worked.)

Responsibilities include cleaning of liturgical vessels, linen and vestments and stock control of consumables to ensure everything is available and in good order the parish liturgies. Please note a DBS check will be required for the sacristan role. Remuneration will be paid at the appropriate National Living Wage rate.

Saint of the Week—St Charles Borromeo, Bishop: On Saturday 4th November, we remember Charles Borromeo, born in Italy in 1538 and a descendant of nobility, who was the Archbishop of Milan from 1564-1584). He was responsible for significant reforms within the Catholic Church in response to the Protestant Reformation, overseeing reform in Rome, and then in Milan. Milan was the largest archdiocese in Italy at the time, with more than 3,000 clergy and 800,000 people; both clergy and laity had drifted from church teaching. He restored dignity to divine service, and established seminaries, colleges and communities to educate candidates for the priesthood. In 1576 he played a significant role in feeding almost 70,000 people daily using his own funds, during a time of plague and hardship in Milan. He fell ill with a fever in 1584, and died at the age of 46. St Charles is the patron saint of bishops, catechists and seminarians.
