It can be a very uncomfortable feeling, but it isn't hopeless - there are some lotions and medicines that can help to ease the itching. And in a few days, the sores go away and life is back to normal.

During the time when Jesus lived upon the earth, leprosy was very widespread and was a dreaded disease. When someone had leprosy, they were covered with sores all over their bodies. Unlike chicken pox, these sores didn't just go away. When someone had leprosy, it *was* hopeless, because there was no cure. Lepers were considered to be 'unclean', and other people were not allowed to touch them. Many people even believed that lepers got the disease because of some terrible sin they had committed.

One day a man with leprosy came to Jesus. The man knelt down before Jesus and said, "If you will, you can make me clean." Jesus looked at the man and he felt love and compassion for him. He reached out his hand and touched the man and said, "I am willing, be clean." Immediately, the leprosy left the man and he was cured.

Sometimes, we may find ourselves in a situation where we are uncomfortable, but there may come a time in our lives when we find ourselves in a situation that is truly hopeless. Word Search


