Listen to the Whole Gospel according to St Mark: If you were not quite ready to embark of the whole 'Bible in a Year' journey in 2024, how about listening to the whole of the Gospel of St Mark for Lent? On Day 154 to Day 161 of the Bible in a Year podcast, Fr Mike Schmitz reads and explains this entire Gospel, in accessible 25 minute episodes. The podcast is available on all the major Apps, and on YouTube (with subtitles): just search 'Bible in a Year Fr Mike'. There is also a useful overview to the Gospel of St Mark: just search: 'Messianic Checkpoint: The Gospel of Mark (with Jeff Cavins) – 2022'.

Saint of the Week – St Oswald, Christian warrior king of Northumbria: On the 28th February, we remember St Oswald, an Anglo Saxon king of Northumbria who was exiled to Scotland by a rival king. Whilst in exile, he learned the Christian faith from Celtic monks and was baptised on the island of Iona – still a place of pilgrimage today. On the death of his rival in the year 633, Oswald returned to Northumbria to try and claim back his father's kingdom. St Bede writes about him 100 years later, and tells us how Oswald set a large wooden cross in the ground, and kneeling down, prayed to God that He would send them heavenly aid. Summoning his army with a loud cry, he asked them all to kneel and to ask the true and living God Almighty for His protection. Battle then commenced, and Oswald regained his kingdom. He then sent for missionaries from Iona to help convert his mostly pagan army and kingdom, even interpreting the word of God into the local language so his nobles and leaders could understand. He died in a later battle, aged 35 years, praying for his bodyguard who were killed as they tried to protect him.
