Sharing the Gospel with others – how do we talk about what Jesus did for us on the Cross? At the end of every Mass, we are encouraged to share the message of the Gospel. But how do we do that? How do we share the good news of Jesus with our troubled world? First, we can find opportunities to tell others 'God loves you, and He has an amazing plan for your life'. Then we can explain that 'sin has disrupted that plan, but that God sent his only Son, Jesus, to come and save us'. But how exactly do we explain what Jesus did for us, to the unchurched? Try saying something simple along these lines: Jesus came and led a perfect life – because we can't manage that for ourselves. And then he paid the price for our sins, by choosing to die a painful, hideous death on a cross for us. He took the just punishment for our sins upon Himself, so that we wouldn't have to, and so that through him, we may become reconciled with God the Father. This is a personal gift for you: the ultimate gift of love – and freely given!

Saint of the Week – St Bernadette of Lourdes: On Tuesday 16th April, we remember St Bernadette, who received a total of 18 appearances of the Blessed Virgin Mary from 11th February to 16th July in the year 1858, in a cave above the banks of the Gave River near Lourdes in Southern France. Bernadette was just 14 years old, and came from a family that lived in extreme poverty. Although Bernadette's initial reports provoked scepticism, her daily visions of "the Lady" brought great crowds of the curious. The Lady, Bernadette explained, had instructed her to have a chapel build on the spot of the visions. There, the people were to come to wash in and drink of the water of the spring that had welled up from the very spot where Bernadette had been instructed to dig, for healing of body and spirit. In the vision on 25th March, Our Lady told Bernadette, "I am the Immaculate Conception". After thorough investigation, Church authorities confirmed the authenticity of the apparitions in 1862; in the 160 years since Bernadette dug up the spring, 70 cures have been verified by the Lourdes Medical Bureau as 'inexplicable'. Bernadette said that it was faith and prayer that cured the sick. But there was not to be a cure for Bernadette there herself: a bout of childhood cholera had left her with severe and chronic asthma, and eventually she contracted tuberculosis. She died on the 16th July 1879, aged 35 years. Thirty years later, her body was exhumed and discovered to be incorrupt.
