Historic 'Blue Plaque' proposal for St Marie's: A local charity, Sheffield Home of Football, wants to mark the contributions of John Charles Shaw and Michael Joseph Ellison to Sheffield's sporting heritage, and is seeking permission to put up two Blue Heritage Plaques in the environs of the Cathedral. Shaw founded Hallam FC—the world's second oldest football club—and was the captain of the team which won the world's first football tournament. He was also President of the Sheffield Football Association when the Sheffield rules for the game became part of the national FA rules, in 1877. Ellison—a leading Catholic whose family donations to St Marie's Cathedral included the window in the North Transept—played a key role in the creation of Sheffield United and Yorkshire County Cricket Club. In particular, he negotiated the use of land at Bramall Lane as a new cricket pitch and, later, football ground, making it the world's first multi-purpose sports ground. In terms of the plaques, the charity is seeking permission to put a plaque commemorating Shaw's life on the exterior of the Priest's Sacristy, towards the bottom of Norfolk Row, where Shaw had a legal office before the extensions to the Cathedral complex were built. The plaque commemorating Ellison's life would be above the Nottingham Building Society offices, where the Cathedral's Houlden Hall now is. Neither plaque would be on the Cathedral building itself. Saint of the Week - St George, Patron Saint and Martyr: On Tuesday 23rd April, we remember St George—the Patron Saint of England (and Catalonia)—who died on this day in the year 303AD. Interestingly, he is known and revered by both Muslims and Christians. George was born to Christian nobility and was both a Roman officer and a Greek native of Lydda (modern-day Lod in Israel). He served as an imperial guard for the Emperor, Diocletian, at Nicomedia. There are several stories about George fighting dragons, but in the Western version, a dragon (or large crocodile) made its nest at a spring that provided water to the city of Selem in Libya. To appease the dragon, the inhabitants offered him 2 sheep a day, and later a sheep and a child drawn by lot. One day, the king's own daughter was chosen, and as she headed to the spring. George passed by and pierced the dragon with his spear – a gesture that became a symbol of faith triumphing over evil. In 303 AD, Diocletian, who hated Christians, announced that every Christian the army passed would be arrested, and every other soldier should offer a sacrifice to the Roman gods. George refused. In an effort to save George, Diocletian attempted to convert him to believe in the Roman gods, offering him land, money and salves in exchange for offering a sacrifice to the Roman gods; but George continued to refuse, and publicly professed his faith in Christ. For this he suffered terrible torture, and was eventually beheaded. Shortly after his death, a basilica was erected over the place of his burial in Lydda, and his relics are still visible there today. But it was the crusaders who transformed the figure of St George-the-martyr into a 'holy warrior', invoking him as the protector of all soldiers, and it was with through the Normans that the cult of St George became firmly rooted in England.
