**Devotion of the Month—The Sacred Heart of Jesus:** During the month of June, we are all invited to focus particularly on the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the Feast of which we always celebrate the Friday after Corpus Christi. In four mystical visions, Jesus appeared to St Margaret Mary Alacoque (between 1673-1675), giving her revelations of the great love of his Sacred Heart for mankind. Like all relationships, our relationship with Jesus requires communication to keep it strong and vibrant. Prayer is our ongoing conversation with God. St Mary Margaret explains: “We can tell him all the secrets of our hearts, disclosing our want and misery to Him who alone can remedy them, and saying, “O Friend of my heart, she whom you love is sick. Visit and heal me, for I know well that you cannot love me and yet leave me alone in my distress.” So, take some time this month to talk with the Lord and share your heart with him in prayer. Tell him your fears and the ways in which you feel unlovable. Ask him for healing. Ask him to show you how much he loves you. Jesus loves to answer these kinds of prayers!

**Annual Diocesan Padley Pilgrimage—Sunday 7th July:** The Diocese of Hallam is once again joining the Diocese of Nottingham for the annual pilgrimage to Padley, in honour of the two Padley Martyrs: Blessed Robert Ludlum and Blessed Nicholas Garlick. Bishop Patrick McKinney (the Bishop of Nottingham) will be the chief celebrant, and Bishop Ralph will be the preacher. Please assemble at 3.00pm at Grindleford Station, for the procession to the Chapel. Mass commences at 3.30pm. **Saint of the Week—St Anthony of Padua, "Evangelising Doctor of the Church":** On Thursday 13th June, we remember St Anthony of Padua, one of the Catholic Churches most popular saints. Born as Fernando Martins de Bulhões in Lisbon, Portugal in the 13th Century, Fernando joined the Canons Regular of St Augustine and was eventually ordained a priest. Seeking greater solitude, he moved 100 miles away to Coimbra, and there met a group from the newly founded Franciscan Order. The Franciscans were travelling preachers, relying upon divine providence rather than the income produced by large estates. When 5 Franciscan missionaries had been martyred in Morocco by Muslims, Fernando was so moved by the courage of these martyrs and by the witness of their fellow friars, that he joined the Franciscans – taking the name 'Anthony', after Saint Anthony of Egypt, the patron saint of the friars' house in Coimbra. Although his intention had been to emulate these five martyrs, God had other plans for him. A serious illness and then a storm which blew his ship off course, resulted in him landing in Sicily. There it was discovered that he had an exceptional gift for preaching; sometimes as many as 30,000 would come to hear him! He preached far and wide for the next several years, until his death at the age of 35 years. Many legends surround Fr Anthony's preaching and miracles. He is known as the patron saint of lost items, because one day a friar stole an important book of Psalms from him, with his own extensive notes in it; Fr Anthony prayed for its return, and the friar was so convicted in his heart that he returned it and repented. St Anthony is also often depicted holding the Child Jesus, because of an account of a friar who saw Anthony in deep prayer, conversing with the Christ Child. St Anthony – your life may have been short, but your pursuit of holiness led to an abundance in grace! Please help us also to pursue holiness, and by God's grace, to discover how best to serve His holy will. Amen.
