**Devotion of the Month - The Sacred Heart of Jesus:** During the month of June, we are all invited to focus particularly on the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the Feast of which we always celebrate the Friday after Corpus Christi (27th June this year). In four mystical visions, Jesus appeared to St Margaret Mary Alacoque (between 1673-1675), giving her revelations of the great love of his Sacred Heart for mankind. These revelations to Margaret Mary – and other saints who have come before and after her, give us a tiny glimpse of the great love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus for us, and mankind more generally. Like all relationships, our relationship with Jesus requires communication to keep it strong and vibrant, so let's use this month as a spring-board to learning how to talk to the Lord, heart to heart. Tell him your fears and the ways in which you feel unlovable... Ask him for healing... Ask him to show you how much he loves you. Jesus loves to answer these kinds of prayers! There are also some suggested prayers on the display at the back of Church that you may find helpful.

**Saint of the Week—Saint Josemaría Escrivá de Balaguer, priest:** On Thursday 26th June we remember St Josmaría Escrivá, a Spanish priest who was ordained in 1925. Three years later, by divine inspiration, he founded Opus Dei – a Personal Prelature of the Catholic Church that fosters among Christians the search for holiness in the world, especially in the ordinary circumstances of life and the sanctification of work. His life was one of faith, a life holy and full of God – and a life dedicated to doing God's will and bringing to the world the message God entrusted to him: "Sanctity is not for a privileged few. The Lord calls all of us. He expects love from all of us – from everyone, wherever they are; from everyone, whatever their state in life, their profession or job. For the daily life we live, apparently so ordinary, can be a path to sanctity: it is not necessary to abandon one's place in the world in order to search for God... Because all the paths of the earth can be the occasion for an encounter with Christ". He died suddenly in Rome in 1975, after a final affectionate glance at a picture of Our Lady in the room where he worked, and was canonized in 2002 by Pope St John Paul II.
