The Mass is a big deal – so let's reflect on the offertory of our past week: What a gift the Mass is! We all know it, and yet on many occasions we may recognise that in our hearts we are not entering into it with the full devotion and participation it truly deserves. The Offertory and preparation at the altar may be a time we are tempted to zone out for a while. But this is a solemn moment, when we are invited to reflect on the offertory of our past week in our hearts: all the sacrifices we made, all the good works we did, all the suffering we endured... None of it ever done in vain. In this very graced point of the Mass, let us unite our personal offertory with the sacrifice of Christ Jesus on the altar. Let us lift up our hearts to our Lord!

Devotion of the Month – to the Holy Family: During the month of February, we are encouraged to focus more deeply on the Holy Family, which honours Jesus, Mary and Joseph – the 'created trinity', and the 'embryonic church' – as a model for all Christian families. This devotion is associated with February because of the feast of the Presentation of the Lord (also known as Candlemas and the Purification of Our Lady) which is celebrated on the 2nd February – this Monday. As St Joseph, with the Blessed Mother, holding the 40-day-old Jesus, and ascending the Temple stairs to make an offering to the Lord for their firstborn son, let us reflect on the complete humility we are also called to have before God's law and His holy will. And let us invite the Holy Family into our prayer life, and into our home, and ask them to show us one thing we can change to draw our family closer to God within the Church, just as the Holy Family modelled for us on that first Candlemas.

Saint of the Week – St Agatha, Virgin and Martyr: On Thursday 5th February, we remember St Agatha, who lived in Catania in Sicily, during the third century. The city of Catania is at the foot of Mount Etna, the biggest volcano in Europe. St Agatha had a brief life; it was a model of Christian devotion, but when she turned down an offer of marriage from the Roman proconsul, Quintianus, her humiliated suitor had her arrested for being a Christian (an offence at the time). Quintianus used progressively worse forms of torture to try and persuade her, but despite suffering terribly in prison, she radiated joy and constantly held her head up high. Quintianus then ordered her to be tortured and hideously mutilated, but Agatha experienced a miraculous healing after receiving a vision of St Peter coming to heal her. She chose a slow and painful death to show her undying love for her Divine Spouse, Jesus (rather than deny him), and during this final torture, an earthquake occurred that rocked the entire city. She died shortly afterwards, and was immediately recognised as a saint. When Mount Etna then erupted about a year later, and threatened to engulf Catania, terrified inhabitants ran for their lives but some decided to put their trust in the local saint. They took Agatha's veil from her tomb, and stood defiantly in the path of the oncoming lava, praying for her aid. It is said that miraculously, the lava altered its course at the last minute and passed by Catania, sparing the inhabitants of certain death. St Agatha is still much loved and celebrated with festivals in Catania today.
