The Mass is a big deal – so, let's all actively participate: What a gift the Holy Mass is! We all come to Mass to approach the true and living God, and to give Him the worship He truly deserves. It is not something we should ever do lightly. Here are some tips to help you engage more earnestly with the beauty of the Mass:

- (1) stand / sit / kneel at the appropriate times – every action has deep meaning and purpose;
- (2) really listen to the words that are being spoken – and ideally, follow the Holy Scripture for yourself. Daily Mass readings can be found in *My Day by Day* (only £1 per month), or in the more detailed *Magnificat* (£6.75 per month), or in a variety of online forms, both free and by subscription. Sunday Missals are also available;
- (3) join in with all the responses, truly praying the Mass in unity with the rest of the congregation. If you don't yet know the responses, you can buy an Order of Mass Card or a *Simple Prayer Book* for the words, or invest in a Sunday Missal. You can explore the faith resources we have for sales in our shop, or make a request via the office if you can't find what you are looking for;
- (4) sing when you are invited to! Singing praise to our God is an essential part of our worship, so sing for our Lord, joining in with joy with whatever voice He blessed you with. And finally
- (5) use the quiet moments in the Mass to lift your heart up to the Lord, and listen to what He has to say to you. Be expectant; your God is waiting for you!

Marriage Preparation: Please note that if you are planning to get married, you need to contact one of the Priests at least six months before the wedding. This has to be done even if your wedding is taking place abroad or your betrothed lives abroad. If you have any queries, do speak to one of the Priests or contact the Cathedral office (office@stmariecathedral.org) as soon as possible.

Devotion of the Month – to the Holy Name of Jesus: The entire month of January is dedicated to devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus, whose name literally means “God saves”. As we enter into the final week of the month, let us ponder the prayer below that is attributed to St Bernadine of Sienna – the Franciscan who spoke so fervently of Jesus’ name: *Jesus, Name full of glory, grace, love, and strength! You are the refuge of those who repent, our banner of warfare in this life, the medicine of souls, the comfort of those who mourn, the delight of those who believe, the light of those who preach the true faith, the wages of those who toil, the healing of the sick. To You our devotion aspires; by You our prayers are received; we delight in contemplating You. O Name of Jesus, You are the glory of all the saints for eternity. Amen.*

Saint of the Week – Saint John Bosco, Educator and Founder: On Saturday 31st January, we remember Saint John Bosco, who was born as a poor Italian boy in Turin in 1815. When he was 9 years old, he had a dream showing that his vocation was to help poor boys. It was at theological college in Turin that he first pursued his calling; he devoted his Sundays to gathering waifs and homeless apprentices from the slums, and running a sort of Sunday School and recreation centre. With the help of his mother, who acted as his housekeeper in the rooms they rented, he started taking in destitute children, and before long, was giving shelter to about 40 boys. Most of these boys were poor apprentices who worked by day in the city. Frustrated by the continuing bad influence of the streets, John set up apprenticeships himself at home. In 1853, as well as running a night school, he opened two workshops to train tailors and shoemakers. It was so successful that the following year, he founded a congregation for that purpose – known as the Salesians (after St Francis of Sales – a saint he greatly admired). Within 2 years there were 150 resident boys, 4 workshops and a printing press. By the time of his death, in 1888, Saint John Bosco had well over 700 Salesians operating worldwide. He is now the patron saint of apprentices, boys and school children.
